Monthly, we send you an updated social media guide on the High Impact Practices in Family Planning (HIPs) with the purpose of (1) increasing awareness and use of the HIP briefs, and (2) generating traffic on the HIP website. Please share!

This month's social media messages are focused on the new brief titled: Social Accountability to improve family planning information and services. This HIP brief focuses on social accountability approaches for family planning that are designed with the following criteria: 1) primarily operate at the subnational level, where the community and health facility intersect; 2) involve a high degree of community influence and control; 3) are largely collaborative in nature rather than confrontational; 4) facilitate community voice and bolster service provider/power holder responsiveness; and 5) are structured, facilitated, and transparent processes that create safe and inclusive space for effective dialogue and negotiation. A number of generic and branded tools have been developed to facilitate social accountability processes, including Community Score Card (CSC), Citizen Voice and Action (CVA), public hearings, and social audits, for which this brief provides further detail. The brief includes tips for implementation and measurement, so that programs can implement social accountability mechanisms to support the development of an enabling environment for family planning.
